

Preliminary Consumption Information

January 2020

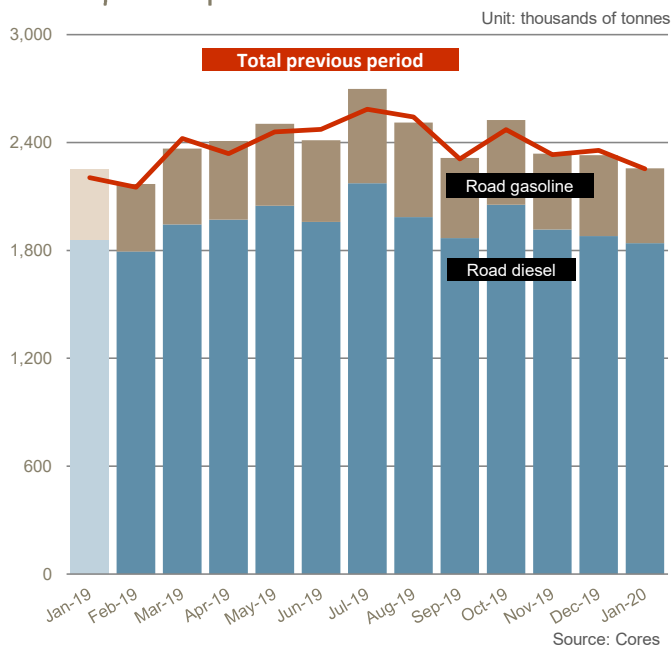
Road fuel consumption rose by 0.4% in January 2020 (2,262 kt) vs. January 2019

In January, after the decrease of the previous month, road fuel consumption rose again (+0.4% vs. January 2019), increasing to 2,262 kt and having surpassed the last months of January of the 10 previous years. Gasolines rose (+6.4%), with the highest consumption for a month of January since 2009, whilst road diesel decreased (-0.8%).

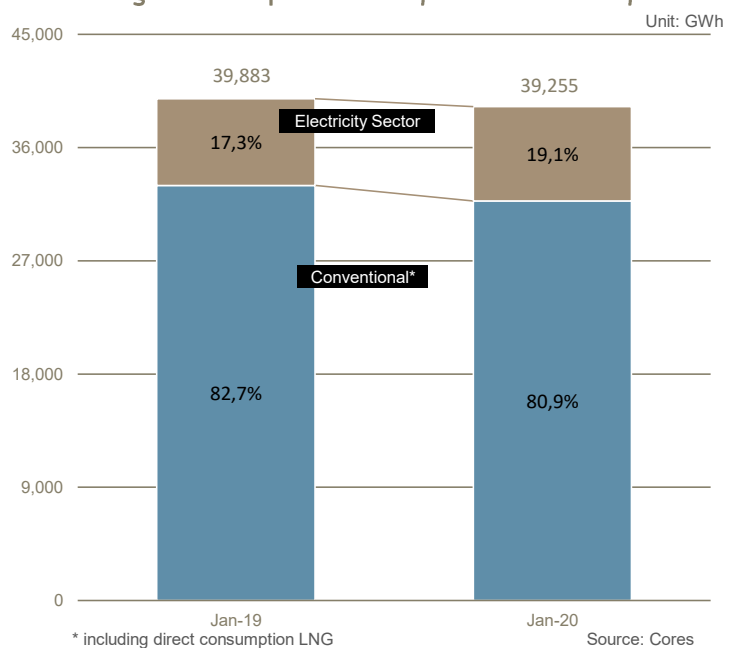
This month, gasolines consumption (+6.4%) and gasoil (+0.6%) rose, whilst fuel oil (-36.2%), LPG (-11.3%), and kerosene (-0.6%) decreased.

After nine months of increases, natural gas consumption diminished in January (-1.6% vs. January 2019), having reached 39,225 GWh. Natural gas intended for electricity generation (+8.9%) increased again after the decrease of the previous month, whilst conventional consumption decreased (-3.9%) and direct consumption LNG (+0.0%) is similar to last year.
