

# Crude oil Spanish imports by country

## May 2014

### Increase of crude oil imports in May +5.9%

In May, Spanish crude oil imports increased (5.9% vs May 2013), reversing the tendency registered since August 2013, reaching 5,530 kt. The average for the rolling year (4,751 kt) is surpassed by 16.4%. Imports from Central and South America showed a 35.7% increase, 20.7% from Europe and Eurasia and 11.9% those from Africa, standing out the escalation of imports from Brazil (157.1%), Colombia (102.0%), Algeria (350.0%) and Angola (217.8%), becoming the main supplier for the month. There is a drop back from North America (-16.2%) and the Middle East (-18.6%). In May, 26 crudes from 17 countries were imported.

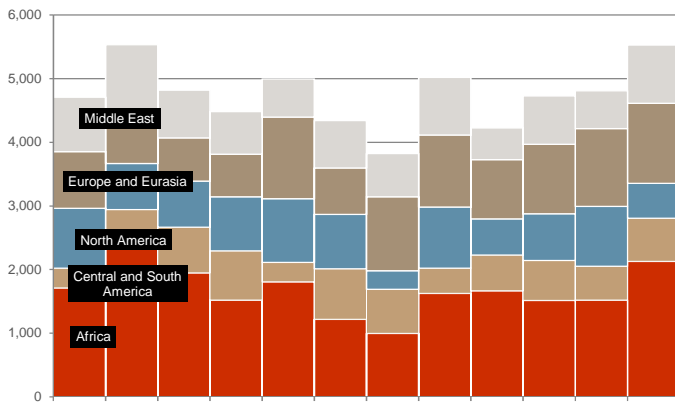
In the YTD, main suppliers remain Russia (17.3%), Nigeria (16.1%) and Mexico (15.4%).

For 2014, crude oil imports from OPEC countries continue to decline (-9.7%), representing 49.7% of the total. Imports of countries outside OPEC increase slightly in the YTD (3.8%), surpassing in the rolling year (50.3%) those registered by OPEC (49.7%).

Geographically, Africa remains the main area of crude oil supply in the rolling year (35.1%), despite its weight loss in the structure, in benefit of Central and South America (12.2%) and Europe and Eurasia (20.8%), both presenting a gain of 12.9% and 12.3% in the rolling year respectively, in contrast with Africa's 9.9% drop.

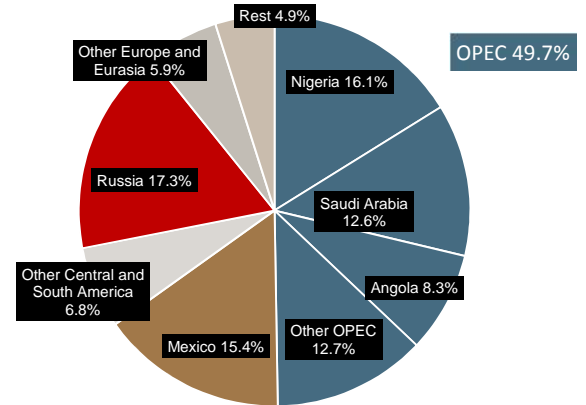
### Crude oil imports by geographical area
